First Responders provide initial care and assessment of patients prior to ambulance arrival. To become a member of the First Responders you must complete a 72-hour class available at LTC in Cleveland. Wisconsin licensed RN's may be eligible to have the initial training requirement waived. Firefighters must complete two 30-hour classes also available at LTC. Please contact Tony at 920-905-1138 if you have any questions or would like more information.

These are the minimum requirements to join. If you would like more information or if you would like to visit us to observe a drill night, we'd love to have you! First Responders drill the 2nd Thursdays of each month and Firefighters drill the 1st and 3rd Mondays of each month starting at 7 pm.

Meetings are the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of each month rotating with other nearby Fire Departments learning and working together to train future Firefighters. LNRP and Friends of Hika Bay Resume Water Quality Monitoring with UWGB Interns

Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP) is resuming its annual water quality monitoring in Manitowoc County with the Lakeshore Water Institute at UW-Green Bay's Manitowoc Campus. Led by Professors Becky Abler and Rick Hein, the "Stream Team" of undergraduate interns monitors Centerville Creek, Fischer Creek, Point Creek, Pine Creek, Calvin Creek, and the Little Manitowoc River. Intern stipends and supplies are funded by the West Foundation and the Fund for Lake Michigan.

These trees add into the grove of other oaks, apples trees and sugar maples dedicated to Edith Lutze, Gilbert Arndst and Verne Wernecke over the last two decades.
