

## Now Open: Lakeshore College's New Froedtert & the Medical College of Wisconsin Center for Health Care Excellence

Lakeshore College, formerly known as Lakeshore Technical College, opened the doors to its new Froedtert & the Medical College of Wisconsin Center for Health Care Excellence in August.

Demand continues growing among local hospitals and clinics for thoroughly trained healthcare professionals in the fields of nursing, radiography, medical assistant, ophthalmic assistant, and emergency medical services. The state-of-the-art facility doubles Lakeshore's capacity to 1,500 students pursuing careers in these areas.

New technology and equipment includes patient simulators, which are high-tech mannequins students train with to achieve a very realistic experience in the classroom. With dedicated space for each program, emergency services students can begin realistic training scenarios in Lakeshore's advanced training complex before moving in real-time to the facility's new emergency rooms.

Construction began on the 16,000 square foot, \$6 million facility in June of 2023 and finished on schedule.

The college's foundation secured over \$3 million from lead donors including Froedtert & the Medical College of Wisconsin, Franciscan Sisters of Christian Charity, West Foundation, Frank G. and Frieda K. Brotz Family Foundation, and Lakeshore Community Foundation. Funds raised went toward the new facility and scholarships for students enrolled in healthcare programs.

Lakeshore Technical College is undergoing a name change to Lakeshore College. Lakeshore President Dr. Paul Carlsen says the new name, approved by the college's Board of Trustees in July, emphasizes the college's commitment to providing both pre-bachelor's degree and technical programs.

# Russ Tooley Citizen Activist



Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP) and the Lakeshore Community lost an important community leader and citizen activist this past summer with the passing of Russ Tooley.

As President of the former Centerville CARES, Russ Tooley has had extensive hands-on involvement with the issues associated with Wisconsin's Lake Michigan shoreline. Russ led the fight for recognition of pollution dangers from buried crop field-tiles. With support from the Lake Michigan Stakeholders group and Wisconsin Sea Grant, Russ worked to develop an 18-minute DVD, All Washed Up; Lake Michigan's Algae Challenge, explaining Cladophora algae and what can be done to mitigate this problem.

Russ was a charter member of the Friends of Hika Bay, one of the first LNRPsupported watershed groups. As chair of the water quality committee, he helped establish a student intern program at UW-Green Bay Manitowoc Campus. Initiated in 2010, the program led to the formation of the Lakeshore Water Institute. The summer water quality sampling program now engages 4-6 undergraduate interns as the "Stream Team" that monitors Centerville Creek, Fischer Creek, Point Creek, Pine Creek, Calvin Creek, and the Little Manitowoc River. The baseline database was used as part of the modeling and reduction targets for the Northeast Lakeshore Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL) and includes e-coli, phosphorus, nitrogen, and six additional water quality parameters. Data stories are presented annually by the student interns at the Lakeshore Water Summit.

This year the summit will be held on Wednesday, October 9th from 6:00 – 9:00 pm at the UW-Green Bay Manitowoc Campus. We hope you will join LNRP and the Stream Team in honoring Russ's legacy at the event.

Russ... We will miss you dearly and promise to continue the effort to improve water quality and the quality of life in the Lake Michigan basin.
