Strengthening Community and Conservation: Get Involved with Friends of Hika Bay!

At Lakeshore Natural Resource Partnership (LNRP), we're growing our team! This past October, we welcomed **Sam Frauenfeld** as our new **Partner and Projects Coordinator**. Sam, a Cleveland native now living in Manitowoc, has a deep-rooted passion for the local environment and community. She joined us part-time while completing her degree at the University of Wisconsin-Green Bay (UWGB) and will transition to full-time after graduating in May. With a love for water, nature, and community engagement, Sam is excited to contribute to conservation efforts in the region she calls home.

Sam's journey with LNRP began during her time at UWGB-Manitowoc, where she worked as a research intern with our community partner group, Lakeshore Water Institute (LWI). Since its inception in 2009, LWI has been a collaborative partner with LNRP and UWGB-Manitowoc helping to educate and engage students in water quality data collection for Manitowoc County's watershed, including Centerville Creek in Cleveland. This unique partnership helped build the Friends of Hika Bay (FOHB) in Cleveland to provide citizen-led support for a restoration project beginning at Centerville Creek. FOHB has expanded its mission and is an LNRP partner group dedicated to protecting and restoring the Sevenmile watershed - which includes Silver, Centerville, Fischer, Point, Pine, and Calvin Creeks, all flowing directly into Lake Michigan.


