## Village of Cleveland

Greetings from the village board, since Decembers update the board has primarily focused on items that were shelved towards the end of last year to ensure a timely completion and approval of budget. Staff have been busy with some ongoing items and transition work, which includes 3rd party accounting/auditing and engineering services.

**Police Department:** The chief of police completed an update of the village's emergency management plan; the board has approved and adopted this plan. The PD also continues to look for a part time certified officer with experience. This is a board approved and budgeted position, if you or anyone you know is interested, please contact the village hall. PD also continues to enforce our village ordinances, specifically Sec. 8-4-8. Pertaining to Junked/Unregistered vehicles and appliances on private property.

**Water Quality:** A vendor was chosen to provide and set up the pilot treatment systems. This vendor will train village staff on how to operate the equipment during the pilot study. The vendor also indicated they may be able to get to Cleveland as early as the beginning of march to start testing. The pilot study is expected to last approximately three to four weeks.

**Village Inspector:** Early this year our current village building inspector has informed the board of their intentions to retire. The village is currently working through the process to find a replacement as timely as possible. Since the village utilizes other hired individuals for inspections like electrical and plumbing, we expect no impact on our citizens who are or are planning to do work.

**Bulk Goods:** The village has scheduled our bulk goods event to take place on May 30th and Electronics recycling on June 6. Watch our website in the coming weeks for more details.

# East Wind Garden Club

Hello, Gardeners!

Are you as tired of winter as I am? It's not too early to plant those perennial seeds outside.

No, I haven't lost my mind...yet. There's this thing call "winter sowing" that's becoming quite popular. You'll need a clean milk jug, no cap, a little moist potting soil, duct tape, a few seeds and a marker to label the jug.

1. At just shy of the middle of the jug, slice almost all the way around the jug so you have sort of a hinge.
2. Fill bottom jug with potting so, not seed starter soil.
3. Sprinkle seeds on soil and gently press into soil.
4. Put a small label with seed name in it.
5. Take the duct tape and tape your milk jug back together.
6. Label outside of jug. It's important to label inside and out because the sun fades out the outer label.
7. Place outside in the sun but where winds won't blow the jug away. It's light weight. It will get enough moisture from the cap opening.

By the time you are ready to plant other things in the garden, you should be able to plant these seedlings out and you won't have to harden them off because they were outdoors all along. This could save you a lot of money at the garden center.

It's membership drive time for the garden club. We have only 4 indoor meetings at the firehouse. They are in March, April, September and October and a few other gatherings during the year. Our dues are \$15.00 a year.


